#### Students as Co- Designers

Recently, staff and leadership from Hackham East Primary School visited us to learn about students as co-designers in their learning. Our Upper Primary students explained how we develop surface learning ie the 'facts' you need to know about the things you are learning about. During that time, students generate questions or 'wonderings' they wish to explore further. This becomes the 'deep learning', which our students co-design against the achievement standard. Getting the balance right between surface and deep learning is critical for successful learning.

Principal, Bob Thiele, sent me the following email; 'Thank you so much for giving your precious time to host us at your wonderful school. We learnt so much from you, your teachers and students. The children were so eloquent, confident and were obviously very proud of their school and their learning. Seeing the shop in action with the children in their roles with the visitors was so impressive.'

Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths (STEM) is a priority of our Site Improvement Plan in 2017. In Term 1, students in Upper Primary have been engaged in 2 investigations: the creation of whiteboard erasers and Jimu Robots.



# Whiteboard Erasers

Students used a 3D modelling program to create designs for whiteboard erasers which were then printed on a 3D printer. The eraser's design specification included:

- It had to be easily identified by the owner
- It had to fit into maths toolkits
- It had to clean white boards successfully
- It had to have long term use




# Jimu Robots

Pictured right are Luke and Larissa, Maddi & Leah with their robots.


