Assessing Learning

As the term draws to a close, we need to reflect on what we have achieved and where we need to go next. Assessment is not 'secret teachers' business'; it is a continuous and ongoing process of planning, evaluating and reflecting, a partnership between teachers and students.

Assessment for learning involves teachers using evidence about students' knowledge, understanding and skills to inform their teaching. Sometimes referred to as 'formative assessment', it usually occurs throughout the teaching and learning process to clarify student learning and understanding.

Assessment of learning assists teachers in using evidence of student learning to assess achievement against outcomes and standards. We use the Australian Curriculum Achievement Standards at each year level to help us do this.

Assessment as learning occurs when students are their own assessors. Students monitor their own learning, ask questions and use a range of strategies to decide what they know and can do, and how to use

assessment for new learning.

The purpose of parent/teacher interviews is to share your child's learning journey with you, and as they grow as learners, support them to play an active role in assessment as learning.



Our portfolios, which will go home at the end of each term contain evidence of assessment for, of and as learning and are a great memento of your children's development. Can you please ensure that your child returns his/her portfolio in Week 1 of Term 2.

There is so much happening in the next two weeks. Fasten your seat belts; its going to be a bumpy ride!
