#### **Rita's Roar**

**Welcome** to an exciting new year! We have hit the ground running, welcoming a beautiful bunch of new Receptions and Adin in Year 7. We welcome new teacher Danny Baker who will share the Middle Primaries with Kerry, and also work with most classes on the Arts. It's also great to have Hailey and Mel back, with their children also starting in reception.

The Upper Primary information evening was a huge success with lots of families sharing a meal and learning about how the Upper Primary class operates. We have high expectations of our Uppers and they are given many opportunities to extend their learning and leadership. We have already elected house captains and the SRC, but more information will be forth coming in the next newsletter. Needless to say we have an amazing leadership team this year.

We have also had an incredible response to our call for committee membership. The purpose of our committees is to give our community the opportunity to turn learning into action for all of us: parents, students and educators. The Sustainability Committee drives the implementation of sustainable practices in the school and community, and the Lifelong Learning Community drives the implementation of our Site Improvement Plan. This year, we will be focusing on consistency of student and teacher judgement. We have even had a high school student and her mum nominate for the Sustainability Committee to support us to develop Farmer Jones' Paddock.

Did you know that research has shown that there is more variation within schools than between schools? At Mypo, we have always tried to implement whole school approaches to learning to minimise the variation and develop consistency. Following swimming next week, we will be starting a new whole-school reading program. It will be based around the Levelled Literacy Intervention program we currently run, and will be expanded to include most students from Years 1-6. We are very excited by this challenge as the program focuses on the 'Big 6' of reading: phonological awareness, oral language, phonics, fluency, vocabulary and comprehension. In order for our students to develop higher order comprehension strategies (drawing conclusions and making inferences, distinguishing between real and make believe, identifying author's purpose, distinguishing between fact and opinion and interpreting figurative language) explicit and consistent teaching needs to occur across the whole school. As well as this, we will continue with the intervention programs run by Cass Martin. This may have an impact on parents hearing reading in the morning. Please talk to your child's teacher about how best you can support the class if you are interested in hearing reading.

I was so proud to be in the audience of 'Cats' on the weekend. To our students, parents, and former students and parents, I congratulate you on an amazing job! At Mypo we believe that learning happens everywhere and I was astounded by the self discipline required in the theatre, which was magnificently demonstrated by all of the actors ranging from junior primary to adult. Congratulations to everyone associated with the production.

Lastly, on behalf of all of us, I would like to extend heartfelt condolences to the Holland family, on the passing of Barney. Barney was secretary of the Governing Council for many years, but more recently was involved in all of the ANZAC services conducted under my leadership. Barney's commitment to our school supported us to show and grow our TIGER values into the wider community and we, while being sad at his passing, celebrate his contribution to building the culture of Mypolonga Primary School. We send out love to Carol, Tyson and Brad and their families.

## **Ambulance Cover**

There's no way anyone can know when they or their loved ones may need an ambulance. Ambulance costs are not covered by Medicare and even if you have private health insurance, your policy may not cover the cost of an ambulance. Many private health insurance schemes only cover you and your family for emergency ambulance services. Many illnesses or injuries require additional patient transportation, which are classified as 'non-emergency' (e.g. for tests, ongoing treatment or transfer to another hospital). We strongly recommend checking with your private health insurance provider to find out if you are covered for ambulance transport and if so, your level of cover.

The cost of an emergency ambulance is generally around \$934.
