We Roar As One!

We welcome Necia back from leave and therefore we are back to our normal outstanding newsletter!

Two newsletters ago, we informed you that we had to change the date of our School Closure Day from this Friday 31st August to the following Monday 3rd September due to the opportunity for our students to attend a Taikoz drumming workshop. The workshop will take place at the Mypolonga Institute at 9:00am. We will need to take our students up to the Institute at 9:00am sharp and would appreciate our students being at school on time. This performance has been subsidised totally by Musica Viva's 'Music Match' program. This will also enable us to honour our commitment to the Proud Mary on Friday.

As part of the Department's Learning Design, Assessment and Moderation (LDAM) Strategy, 2 extra pupil free days have been set aside specifically to work on developing consistent assessment processes across sites. We will be working with our colleagues at Tailem Bend Primary School to examine the assessment and moderation of writing within the broader context of English on Monday 17th September. We apologise for the close proximity of both days but our calendar is so crowded with commitments we had very little flexibility in date selection.

Students as Change Agents

As part of our STEM learning, many classes are finding problems to solve based on science outcomes, with a waste minimisation focus. There has been a groundswell of action which has been totally student-driven and I have been so impressed by the passion and commitment of our students to create their own futures. Coinciding with the ABC television series 'The War on Waste', our Eco-warriors, a group of passionate change agents, are exploring actions to initiate, based on scientific research. We are using 'Solution Fluency' as a problem-solving tool.

The 6 Ds of Solution Fluency are:

Define: the problem

Discover: the research and background information

Dream: using this knowledge to visualise creative solutions

Design: the solution

Deliver: making the dream a reality

Debrief: review and analyse the product and identify potential improvement

Murray Bridge High School is using this same structure in their STEM strategy. You will be hearing lots about waste minimisation in the future. Support your kids to take charge of their future!

Head Injury wrist bands

Student safety and wellbeing is of upmost importance to us at this school. We have recently introduced a new procedure if students receive a bump to head. As previously done, a **red** note will be completed by the staff member

administering treatment and will ask the child to take the note home to their parent/caregiver via their school bag. As well as the red note, a yellow fluorescent wrist band will be applied to your child's wrist with a small note advising of the injury sustained.

We have introduced this procedure in case the red note is misplaced, or possible scenarios such as children going home with other parents, children playing in the yard during a later break or other teachers taking the class during the day who may be unaware of the injury.



As with all injuries, the staff member will assess the bump to the head to see whether it warrants a call home to the parent/caregiver.
