Governing Council Report - End of Year 2019

Congratulations to our students and staff using educational research to drive our Site Improvement Plan – we are thrilled with the success this year! Particularly the improvements in our focus areas of year 1 phonics, middle primary sentence structure and year 6 reading. Our attendance rate is still being met above and beyond, and we have no unexplained absences. Our leadership skills are exceptional. But we are not perfect and there is always room for more improvement. We are here to listen to ideas and each year we reflect and learn.

A real moment where the penny dropped was during a Governing Council meeting where we understood more about very early social interaction and participation in programs such as playgroup held at the school. There are many benefits for attending, such as hearing nursery rhymes which assist children in arriving to the start of their schooling phonologically aware. Their readiness (or non-readiness) then impacts on learning opportunities our staff provide students once the children arrive to school.

At the other end of the primary school timeline, the biggest issue bubbling away behind the scenes is strategies for when all year 7 public school students will be taught in high school from Term 1, 2022. The headline news is our verdict to form 6 classes for the first time in our school's history and the budgeting decisions impacting on this. Like most other schools, we have faced tough choices with staffing, logistics, classroom sizes and finance. One example of this was our financial decision to spend money on a divider in the upper's classroom. We agonised over this for quite some time last year, and as a logistics benefit, it has paid off. Great consideration has been given to the five-year student number projections and what this means in terms of income (or loss of) for the school. The Governing Council has been a sounding board for Rita and the management staff who are doing a wonderful job navigating their way through these important decisions where the sole focus is about benefiting the children attending our great school.

Deepest gratitude to our Tiger community who help us shine bright with innovation. Specific highlights are community leaders of Master Class, staff and parents going above and beyond for school camps and excursions, and to staff who are implementing no technology sessions when students are inside for inclement weather (using the philosophy that iPads are for creating, not consuming). Adopting no bins for our waste management awareness and sustainability has also been innovative and well received.

If you have the desire to help even further, please consider joining the Governing Council. Meetings are Monday evenings at 7.30pm of Week 3 & 8 each term, averaging 1.5 hours. When you think about it, that's only 12 hours of your valued time over the year. There is no homework (except for the Secretary) and it's a great example to set for your child. There are many subcommittees who make a difference at our school behind the scenes through working bees, fund raising, connecting families and supporting pre-schoolers. All of these groups are in need of some fresh blood to support long-standing members and keep the drive alive.

Education is not the sole responsibility of school. As parents and caregivers, we are our children's first teachers, and we are the only ones our kids will have throughout their entire childhood. It is our role to help teach vital lifelong skills to take into adulthood. Congratulations to everyone who continues to invest time and energy into our children, our future. Enjoy the festive season and precious time spent with family and friends.


