Our new structure, comprising six classes, with three teams of two classes (black and gold), has already seen great collaboration between students and teachers to work together to achieve common goals. We also welcome new teacher Kara Lienert to our team. Kara will be covering Hailey Perry, who is on parenting leave in Terms 1 and 2. The rest of our team is back and I have been so impressed by the level of commitment shown by them over the holidays to ensure new classrooms are not only functional but inspirational.

Our Collaborative Structures

At Mypo, we believe our students walk alongside us to create our school culture. We empower them to become leaders of learning and challenge them to inspire others to become better learners. We have many structures to empower our students;

- Student Representative Council (SRC): a comprehensive report will be included in the next newsletter
- House Leaders lead Literacy and Health and PE learning at Mypo. They

coordinate Sports' Day and our literacy challenge, the Champions' Cup (formerly Literacy Cup). Following the dynamic Lip Sync Battle, at last year's concert, which was won by the Queen Team singing 'We are

I particularly want to acknowledge James-Noah, who moved teams (as he has no siblings at school) to assure fluidity in leadership.

We want our students to identify problems in our community and then give them strategies to drive change for their future. We invite students and parents to work with us to build capacity to drive change. We have two committees (who report to Governing Council) to facilitate this:

Sustainability Committee: who meet twice per term to develop our sustainability practices. Last year, the committee tried to implement a no-bin policy. This was totally student-driven, but unfortunately, even though we gave students extra in-class eating time, the amount of litter our students generated in the yard, disappointed the Sustainability Committee. They are keen to educate our learners to generate less waste. Some of these students are members of the Natural Resource Management Board's 'Young Environmental Leaders'.

Student Drop Off/Pick Up

Due to the congestion on Williams Street at home time, we have two 'student pick up' points. A second teacher is on yard duty at the gate along South Bokara Road (other side of the school oval) from 3:25pm until 3:35pm.

We are mindful that there may be times when you are not there to collect your child by 3:35pm. In this instance, your child will return to the library with the yard duty teacher until collected.

Please do not drop off or collect your children from the back of the school (in the staff car parking area) as there is not enough room and a bottle-neck occurs. This is a significant safety concern and we need to keep everyone safe!
