

# 2020 International Competitions and Assessments for Schools (ICAS)

Consent notes were recently sent home with students who have been nominated by their teacher to sit for the Science, English and Maths Assessments this year.

These assessments, unlike NAPLaN, which is for all Year 3, 5 and 7 students, are designed for our 'top' students who have an interest and are skilled in a particular learning area. Assessments will be completed online.

The early return of the signed consents, together with payment is much appreciated.

#### Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)

All schools are required to collect information about the numbers of students that they provide adjustments to under the Disability Discrimination Act (1992) and Disability Standards of Education. This data is used as the basis for national funding.

The NCCD involves the collection of;

- . the number of students receiving adjustments to enable them to participate in education on the same basis as other students
- . the level of adjustment provided to students
- . student's type of disability if known Under the model the definition of disability is broad and includes learning difficulties, health and mental health conditions.

If your child is identified for inclusion in the Collection, the required information will be included in this year's data collection.


As you may be already aware:-




