- . There is no fee to attend our Tiny Tigers.
- . Children aged newborn to age 5 are welcome to attend.
- . Shoes must be worn at all times.
- . While Tiny Tigers is running, each parent/ caregiver has the duty of care for their own child/children.
- . The back playground (near the staff carpark) may be used by Tiny Tigers children under adult supervision.

- . Please sign in on your arrival and sign out on your departure.

- . We are a SunSmart school so the wearing of hats whilst outside during Terms 1, 3 and 4 is essential.
- . Tiny Tigers is an affiliated body of the school's Governing Council and there is a Tiny Tigers' representative who tables a report at Governing Council meetings twice a term.
- . To ensure the sustainability of Tiny Tigers, it is important to identify new births and families moving into the Mypolonga district. If you are aware of anyone meeting this criteria, please let us know!
- . You may like to bring your own small toys if your baby is in the 'mouthing' stage.

To provide a COVID-19 safe environment, please ensure:

- . Adults maintain physical distancing of at least 1.5 metres apart.
- . Avoid close contact activities.
- . Please wash your hands or use hand sanitiser on arrival.
- . Attendees may be asked to leave if they show any signs or symptoms of any illness.
