Every Cloud Has a Silver Lining

One of the consequences of our reclassification, has been a decrease in time that Kerry will be given, to work with our kids in her role as Wellbeing Leader, from 0.3 (3 days a fortnight) to 0.2 (1 day a week). On paper this doesn't appear very significant, but in reality, it makes a massive difference, given Kerry's leadership of the SRC, School Shop and Assembly and all of the events which emanate from these. Out of the blue, I was contacted by the Schools' Ministry Group (SMG), with a view to appointing a Pastoral Care Worker (PCW), to support the wellbeing of our kids.

I explained that we were not able to fund such a position. Paul from SMG suggested I meet with the Murray Bridge Inter-Church group, to ask for funding, which I immediately did. This incredible group, offered to support us, by funding a PCW for 1 day a week for 2 years. Governing Council approved that we move forward with this process, at our meeting last week. We are currently in the process, with SMG to advertise this position, with a view to appoint a PCW to work with us next year. In the words of The Sound of Music: 'When a door closes, a window opens.'

Week 5

Week 5 is massive for all of us; kids, parents, caregivers and educators. We have numerous excursions. Teachers have collaborated to try to make your lives as manageable as possible to drop off and collect your kids from various drop-off and pick-up points. The amount of coordination between the classes has been phenomenal and please be aware that we try really hard to make your lives as workable as possible.

Our **Student Free Day** on Wednesday of Week 5 will enable us, in our teaching teams, to plan how we will configure structures for next year. We have already spent a great deal of time trying to prepare ourselves and our current Year 5/6 kids for transition to high school in 2021. However, this will require more work, especially around how we afford our kids the leadership opportunities, which have always been a cultural rite-of-passage for our older kids. We see this as a chance to be innovative and to design new approaches to the challenges with which we are faced!

COVID Stuff

As advised in our recent email, parents/caregivers may now attend our final assemblies for 2020, being held at 2:45pm on Friday of Week 4 and Week 6, with our end of year assembly being held at school on Thursday of Week 9. The assemblies will be held **outside** so long as social distancing is adhered to (1.5 metres apart). If we have to hold our assembly indoors due to inclement weather, unfortunately, we will have to restrict attendance to students only. We know you will understand that this could be a decision that is made at the last minute. If, on arriving, you notice that assembly is being held indoors, we kindly ask that you don't enter the school library. Again, thanks for your support with this. With regards to our end of year celebrations being held on Wednesday 2nd December 2020, please be aware that you MUST present a ticket on arriving with your name and phone number on the back (to enable social tracing). We are trying so hard to create a new normal at Mypo, where we can meet as a community, but still stay COVID safe. We need to keep TIGER strong!

Wellbeing Wonders - Teach Your Child to Say Thank You

The article below comes from a website titled – verywellmind.com which has numerous articles and information about mental health. I came across this particular one and found it an interesting and important read. I hope you do too.

Encourage your child to say "Thank you" on a regular basis. Offer gentle reminders like, "Your brother let you go first. What should you say to him?" or "What do you say to Grandma for giving you a cookie?"

While it may seem like forcing a "thank you", doesn't stir up any real gratitude, consider it a first step in the process. It can help kids start to recognise when others have given them something, whether it's something tangible like a gift, or intangible like time.

So even if it doesn't seem like genuine appreciation when your child needs a reminder, encouraging them to verbally express appreciation can be an important learning tool for genuine gratitude down the line.

You can also encourage your kids to write "thank you" notes to people who give them gifts or show them kindness. Your child might colour a picture for a grandparent who purchased a birthday gift for them. Or you might encourage your teen to write a "thank you" letter to a special coach who has made an impact on their lives.

Make sure to point out times when your child shows gratitude without a prompt from you. Praise prosocial behavior by saying things like, "I really like the way you thanked your friend for sharing with you today," or "Nice job remembering to say 'thank you' to your teacher when she reminded you to get your backpack." Positive attention will reinforce the importance of showing gratitude.
