Families are encouraged to bring along deck chairs or picnic rugs to sit on. Our students will perform on stage blocks. If you do bring deck chairs, please be mindful of families behind you who may be on picnic rugs.

Parking will be available around the school and surrounding streets. If you have special parking requirements, please contact Necia or Annie to discuss.

We do not envisage families having to bring along food or drink (except water) and toilet facilities will be available.
