Starting up a Kindness Crew was our way of making sure kindness was modelled every day across the school. It's sad that the Kindness Crew was needed and that kindness needs to be taught to some students. However, in saying this, the response to be on this committee was overwhelming!

I once heard a story that will always remain with me...a child walking with a parent past a homeless person will see how their parent reacts and this has a major impact on their learning of empathy. A quick shuffle past the person and shielding what the child sees, will teach them to be scared. A comment of annoyance will teach the child intolerance but a smile will teach the child compassion. Children learn so much from what they see and how others react and respond to situations.

Modelling kindness is the best way to teach it.

Our Kindness Crew are so enthusiastic and the ideas of ways to be kind which they all came up with was enormous!

A few words from some members....Fliss, Sophie, Mak & Bella:

'We believe the Kindness Crew is about spreading kindness to others. We help students when they are feeling down or sad by helping them feel better. We help students in the yard at playtime if they need it and find friends for students who don't have anyone to play with. We like giving out certificates to students for doing kind things and for their birthday, because it makes their day!'

We have a Golden Rule which came from our leader Willow - 'Treat others how you want to be treated.' So simple, and if everyone did just that, what an amazing world we would be living in.

**Premier's Reading Challenge**

Once again, the whole school is participating in the Premier's Reading Challenge. The Challenge continues to be an important initiative that supports the State Government's commitment to improve Reception to Year 12 students' literacy skills and encourages them to enjoy reading. Each student has a record sheet kept at school where they record books they have read. Teachers, SSOs and peers chat with them about the books to establish that the student has comprehended the story. It is a requirement that to finish the Challenge, a student reads a minimum of 8 books from the Premier's list and 4 books of their own choice. The Challenge is to be completed by 3rd September 2021.

**Junior Primary Gold - Zebras**

**Junior Primary Black - PIP (Purposeful Investigative Play)**

Last week, with Mrs Wagenknecht, Junior Primary Black students read the Mem Fox book "Where's the Green Sheep?" During PIP, the class suggested ways to solve the book's problem.

We designed and created many helpful items to help find the green sheep; maps, detectors, binoculars and sniffer dogs.

We are so lucky that we get to learn how to cook and garden at our school. Our Stephanie Alexander Kitchen Garden Program (SAKG) is next level!

Recently, under Annie's direction, the Upper Primary students made fried rice lettuce cups. They used lettuce, silverbeet and eggs from our garden and chooks.

It was too wet to be in the garden on this day so David brought the garden to the classroom. Students had to identify pests and diseases on plants from our garden. They observed and referenced exactly what the problem was and then researched how to solve it.




**Journey of Success**
