




What is a Mixed Media Self Portrait?


Junior Primary Excursion

Mosquitoes

Over the last few weeks, and with the warmer weather now here, a large number of students have been visiting our first aid room with mosquito bites to their arms and legs. Whilst we apply our 'first aid spray' to the affected bites at school to relieve itchiness, here is a tip for you at home, application is especially beneficial soon after being bitten!

Lavender oil!... Lavender oil is great for soothing bites AND preventing them. It's especially unique for treating mosquito bites because lavender is known to stop bleeding while being an anti-inflammatory and antibacterial agent. It is advised to dilute your essential oil with a carrier oil unless you are sprinkling the oil on your sheets to keep mosquitoes away while you are sleeping.


School Hats
