We are very sorry that we are having to do this, but it is the best way to ensure the ongoing safety of our students, staff and community. With the current heightened risk, if we see an increase in cases within the school community, a final decision on postponing Sports' Day will be made next Wednesday. Listening to Reading

Thankyou! I would like to thank all parents who continue to work with their children and school to improve their learning outcomes. We have a great history of students achieving well in reading, this is due to the encouragement of our students to read outside of school time and completing reading requirements at home. Whilst what we are doing is good, it is very important that we continue to improve what we do. I have listened to many students read over the first term of school and have noticed many small errors in their reading habits. Listening to children read 'aloud' is very important. This allows us to hear errors and assist in correcting poor reading habits. I look forward to your ongoing support with this and the further improvement in your children's learning.

Traditionally, staff have sent home student report folders with samples of students work at the end of each term. We have made a decision that these will now be sent home at the end Semester One and Two. Our reporting for the end of Term 1 is through our Parent/Teacher interviews and the 'First Impressions' document that will be emailed home at the end of Term 1.

Soft Plastics Recycling

What is REDcycle? REDcycle is a recovery initiative for soft plastics. REDcycle collaborates with three trusted, Australian owned and based recycling and manufacturing partners who utilise recovered material to produce a range of hundreds of recycled plastic products. We have developed our own soft plastics recycling scheme at school. We are aiming to educate and encourage everyone to reduce their impact on the environment. REDUCE-REUSE-RECYCLE!



We have set up red bins for each class to recycle their soft plastics. The MP Black class has taken on the responsibility of taking the soft plastics into Murray Bridge once a week. The collection bins can be found at Coles, Woolworths or Drakes. . The REDcycle program recovers and recycles over 4 million pieces of soft plastic (bags and packaging) every week!

. REDcycle has recovered and recycled over 540 million pieces of soft plastic since 2011!. That's over 2150 tonnes of soft plastic that will never end up in landfill, on our beaches or in our waterways!

. That's the equivalent to 538 elephants (weighing 4 tonnes each)! Pictured above is Alexis and Harry.
