
As a Leader of my house team, I hope to... help Murray win and get it's name on the Cup!

As a Leader of my house team, I hope to... lead red to victory in Sports' Day and win the Literacy Cup.


The best thing about being a Leader is... getting to listen to kids read and helping them on Sports' Day.
