#### Mypolonga Discovery Trail

Recently, in beautiful sunshine, the Middle Primary Gold Year 2 class continued their learning about Mypolonga and its history by walking along the Mypolonga Discovery Trail.

#### Sign Post 1: Mypolonga Institute: a community hub

Here we met Jenni Llewellyn and Dianne Czechowski at the Mypolonga Institute, where we learnt about the history of the Institute, the impact the River Murray floods had on the community, the swamps and the recent State Road Championships. Our students even got to sing on stage! Thank you Jenni and Dianne for sharing your wealth of knowledge.

#### Sign Post 2: Churches and bakery: food for body and soul

We learned that the bakery used a traditional wood-fired Scotch oven and operated from 1946 until 1964. It is now a private residence.

#### Sign Post 3: Irene Hughes Park: the town's first hub

This corner of the town was once a busy place, with a pioneer store, a church and a cannery. The park is named after Irene Hughes, who collected and recorded the town's history.

#### Sign Post 4: The general store and post office: the commercial centre

This store was built in 1920, with goods arriving by boat. The store owners made deliveries to customers by horse and cart. This building has also been the town's post office since 1920, apart from a thirty year period to 1993 when the post office was in the original butcher's shop next door.

#### Post 5: Mypolonga School: a resourceful institution

The school first opened in 1916 and accommodated 60 children. The families who took up the first blocks in Mypolonga in 1914 were large with many young children.

If you get time, completing the Discovery Trail (approximately 20 minutes) is highly recommended. Thanks Mrs Wagenknecht.. the students loved it!
