Whilst what we are doing is good, it is very important to note that we can always improve what we do. I have listened to many students read over the first term of school and have noticed many small errors in their reading habits. Listening to children read 'aloud' is very important. This allows us to hear errors and assist in correcting poor reading habits. Having children repeatedly read a text that is at their reading level to increase fluency and expression is also very beneficial. I look forward to your ongoing support with this and the further improvement in your children's learning.

HARMONY WEEK










Welcome to our School


