EMS - Attendance

At the end of this week, our school will be changing over to a new digital platform that supports multiple administrative, learning and business management functions from one place. It is called 'EMS' (Education Management System). EMS will provide a centralised, single student record that will exist throughout each student's public education.

Our teachers and administrative staff are in the process of training in this new system. Advancing to this new system will see a change in how we record absences. To help us with this transition, we kindly ask parents/ caregivers to let us know by **4:00pm daily** of any student absences, including the reason of absence (ie. family/illness). In the first instance, please relay this information to your child's classroom teacher (email preferred). Any unexplained absences will now be followed up by your child's classroom teacher. We would also appreciate it if notification of future absences (ie. family travel), can be relayed to classroom teachers by email as soon as possible as exemption from school attendance information needs to be entered into the system.

We will keep you advised of any other changes which may occur in switching over to EMS.

In Week 4, Luke, Noah and Bailey represented the Murraylands and participated in the SAPSASA Cricket State Carnival at West Beach.

The boys played two games a day finishing 5th in their division thanks to three straight wins to finish their campaign.

These students are responsible for raising money for our World Vision Child, Julia (pictured below) and also communicating with her during the year. Once you get voted onto the World Being Committee you stay on it for your whole journey at Mypolonga Primary School. Our committee would like to give you an insight into Julia's life.

Julia ~ Julia is 14 years old and lives with her parents, 1 brother and 1 sister in the Monapo Area Development Program in Mozambique, East Africa. Julia's father and mother are both agricultural labourers. She attends school and her favourite subject is national language. The majority of people in Julia's area are part of the southeastern African ethnic group Makhuwa and speak Makua.

We raise money for our World Vision child by organising a fundraiser every third year. This includes a Colour Run, which we plan on having early next year. We also send the child and their community gifts to support their life and health.


At this time, Julia likes to eat 'Caracata' which is a very hard, dense, boiled dough made of dried cassava flour. It is cut up, rolled into a small ball in the palm of your hand, dipped into meat, vegetable, or fish sauce, and swallowed without chewing. In Mozambique, Julia likes going to church to celebrate festival days. Young people sing, dance, play drums, and do theatrical performances, while women prepare meals like cassava flour and corn-flour pasta for everyone to eat and enjoy.
