Welcome to Term 2! It has been really pleasing to see the way our students have returned to school with great attitude and enthusiasm to continue their learning journey. Thank you to all of our staff who go the extra mile to make sure everything is ready and the learning is prepared!

Focus on Learning

I am excited about some of the new learning opportunities that will be provided this term. In week 3, we are beginning whole school math activities. Every Wednesday, just before recess, all students will be working in small groups according to where they are working developmentally in the Big Ideas in Number. These targeted groups will enable all students to learn where they are and receive support to progress them through the learning stages.

Another exciting project that is taking place is the development of a book documenting the history of the Mypolonga School Shop. Through the leadership of Mr Rance and the support of all staff, students have this amazing opportunity to develop their skills across many curriculum areas in constructing the book. In preparation, we have called on the experience of past Principal and staff Rita O'Brien and Anne Martin to support the process. Last week, our Upper Primary unit students were also visited by an author to talk through the process of developing, editing and preparing to publish a book. I am looking forward to the skills our students and staff will be developing through this process.

Along with these great opportunities, there is a number of excursions and camps that are coming up this term which provide amazing learning opportunities outside of the regular school environment that I am sure all students will benefit from.

NAPLAN

Preliminary NAPLAN results are in, and again our results are pleasing with both the year 3 and 5 cohorts performing strongly in Reading, Numeracy, Spelling, Grammar and Punctuation assessment areas.

Reading at home strongly supports the results of all of our students. Well done to all our students and families who ensure this happens. It makes a huge difference to student outcomes!

Student Wellbeing

Through ongoing staff training in developing student wellbeing, we continue to support and teach students how regulating our emotions allows us to think and learn with clarity. When we are unregulated, our brains work in a purely emotional space and we have difficulty functioning in a safe way. As adults, it is our job to help our children/students to firstly coregulate, and then develop self regulation skills for themselves, not join them in dis-regulation. These skills will help ourselves and our young people fulfil future potential.

Working Together, Sunyl Vogt The single biggest predictor of high academic achievement is reading to children. Not flash cards, not workbooks, not fancy preschools, not blinking toys or computers, but mum or dad taking the time every day or night (or both!) to sit and read them wonderful books.

The savoury scones (pictured right) sound delicious and easy to make!


A Warm Reception by our Receptions!

As part of their enterprise education program, students from all classes design and make items to sell on the outside counter of our School Shop. In this fortnight's newsletter, we would like to showcase items from all classes.

Upper Primary unit -

Chocolate coated & plain apricots \$3.00 / Chocolate coated apricots with almond \$1.00 / Pens \$3.00 / Greeting cards \$1.00 / Lemonade .50c Upper Primary students chocolate dip, bag and sell dried apricots on the outside counter. We thank and appreciate our parent volunteers who come in each week to help with chocolate coating. The unit also sells Mypolonga Primary School personalised pens and greeting cards with unique images on the front of the blank card.
