Testing Boundaries

We must continue to be firm, fair and consistent with our children to let them know they are safe, and we care about their future. This doesn't mean we should protect them from every challenge that they are going to face, or stop them from making mistakes, as we know this is where powerful learning can occur if they are well supported.

Student Free Day Learning

Last Thursday, all school staff attended training at Tailem Bend Primary School to work with other schools from our partnership to focus on how we can improve our students learning across all learning areas, with a particular focus on Maths. The classroom SSOs worked through a clear scaffold that assists them in working with, and providing best outcomes for students that they work with. Admin SSOs spent time together working on the Education Management System and supporting each other's learning in this space. Teachers focused their learning on how we can build resilient, resourceful and reflective learning within the Maths curriculum.

Masterclass

It was fantastic to have Masterclass sessions run a couple of weeks ago. Children were learning so many things from so many different 'masters'. Thanks to all our parent and community volunteers who were able to take the time to teach our students the many and varied skills.

Reading at Home

Reading at home every night is one of the most critical aspects of supporting your child's education at home. It is clearly obvious in student outcomes at school with families who are supporting this to happen. In my eyes, listening to your child read aloud at home is the minimum expectation of homework required. The scientific evidence that backs this up is overwhelming. At times, we have evenings at home where things are difficult and adding homework to the mix just compounds the problem. Sometimes these



evenings can be more often than not. On these evenings, if getting them to read is too hard, the best thing to do might be just to sit down and read to them. Reading aloud with our children, whether it is a favourite book, or a new one they have borrowed from the library, or even their school reader can show your children that you value reading, and could be just the opportunity needed to calm the evening for both you and your children. Reading aloud to them, using your finger to track the words and asking them questions about what you are reading, are all great reading strategies we can model to our children. I hope that this can continue to be made a priority for all our families to support the learning of your children.


