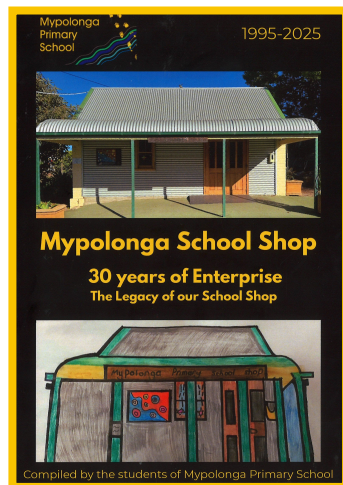
Students in the Middle Primary Black class used forks and paint to create these adorable little chicks. They added their own inspired features and creative touches, bringing each one to life in a unique way!

We thank the @Work students and our Mypo Year 6 students for their enthusiasm and hard work, and we look forward to continuing this partnership.

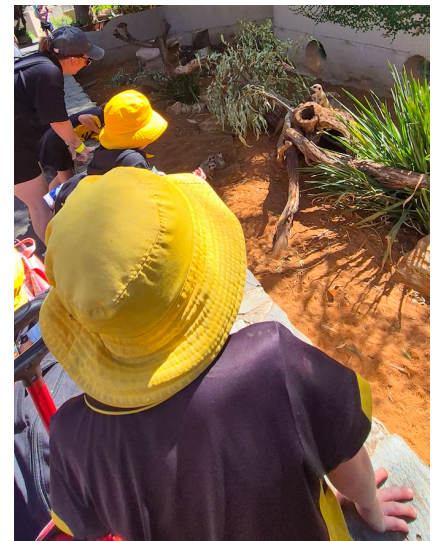


Variety Kids Easter Picnic

We hope all Mums had a great day and loved receiving their handcrafted and 'made with love' gifts for Mother's Day.

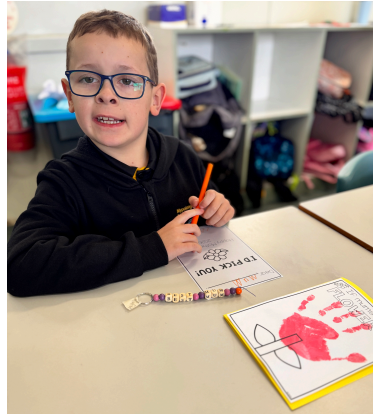

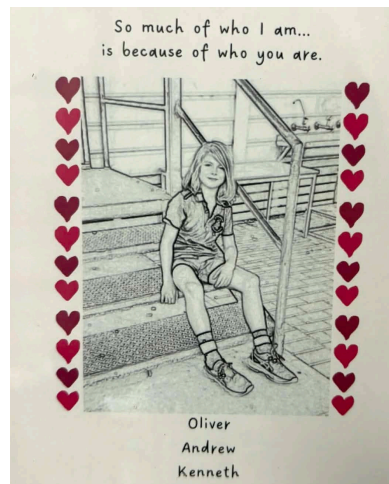

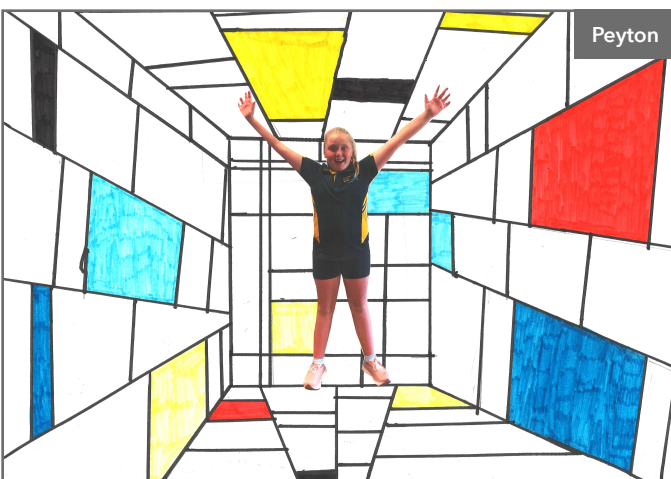
Upper Primary Gold Art - Sunflowers
