Exciting Changes

In 2004, the Murray Bridge Cluster, consisting of Murray Bridge High School, Murray Bridge North, Tailem Bend, Jervois and Mypolonga Primary Schools, were successfully accredited to teach the International Baccalaureate Middle Years' Program.

"A journey of a thousand miles begins with a single step."

~ Lao-Tzu ~

The benefits of the program included:

- A holistic approach to education (how we teach)
- The mapping and implementation of curriculum from Years 6 10 consistently across the cluster (what we teach)
- The use of criterion based assessment practices, which helped students to identify how they could improve. SACSA, the South Australian curriculum framework did not initially have a strong focus on accountability for assessment of student learning or teacher effectiveness. The introduction of the Moving Forward with SACSA strategy, incorporating many of the assessment strategies used in the IBMYP, closed the gap between assessment practices between the two frameworks.
- The development of strong relationships between the high school and feeder primary schools leading to more successful transition processes.

The cluster was successfully re-evaluated in 2008.

2012 saw the introduction of the Australian Curriculum. This Curriculum will be phased in gradually with Maths and Science introduced in 2012 and English and History in 2013. Assessment practices are embedded in the curriculum and significant professional development is available for teachers

Teaching for Effective Learning (TfEL) is a program introduced in South Australian schools, looking at improving teacher effectiveness and student engagement.

The introduction of these programs has made the cluster question the value of IBMYP currently. The IBMYP fulfilled a need in the past that is now unnecessary.

The cluster proposes:

- To not seek evaluation in IBMYP in 2012 and replace it with the Australian Curriculum and Teaching for Effective Learning Frameworks
- To continue to use the structures currently in place for teacher professional development and consistency of teacher judgment.
- To divert current IBMYP budgets to the continuation of cluster processes.
- That the current IBMYP coordinators work together to support the cluster to develop a new model of middle years' learning.





Last Monday night, our Governing Council endorsed this proposal as have all the other cluster Governing Councils. We have the opportunity to create an exciting model where we use what we have learned from the IBMYP but customise it to suit the cluster's specific needs.

Waclaw Janiak – Waclaw Janiak lived in Poland at the time of the war and was put in a youth camp. The Germans attacked the Polish for a battle that could not be lost by the Germans. Waclaw Janiak was about to be sent off in a battle ship full of prisoners into enemy territories. The German enemies didn't know that the battle ship had civilians in it. Just before they loaded the ships, he noticed that a guard was busy, so he sneaked up and stole the weapon of a soldier and knocked him out. Unexpectedly, another soldier was right behind him and then Waclaw got knocked out. Waclaw Janiak was put in a metre deep hole and was left there for 3-4 months. Josiah Oakley – The Buffalo was built as a royal navy ship but came to Australia in 1836. Captain John Hindmarsh commanded the ship. There were 175 other people on board.
