# We've found a spinach recipe our kids like!

At the Recognition Ceremony, some of our wonderful parents made their signature dishes: Chris Walmsley made Anzac biscuits, Jan Baker made jelly slice and Jacqui Sorensen made Weet-Bix biscuits. Yvette Rathjen made spinach cobs, which the students loved! We have been growing spinach in our garden and have tried many different recipes, but this one was a hit.

Here is the recipe:

Ingredients

- 250g pack frozen spinach (we used spinach and bok choy from our garden, which we steamed)
- 500g cream cheese (we used light)
- 3 tablespoons cheese spread (we used light)
- 250g bacon, diced
- 1 onion
- 1/2 cup sweet corn
- 2 cloves garlic
- 2 cobs

Method

- Sauté onion, bacon and garlic.
- Mix together cheeses.
- Add other ingredients.
- Hollow out the cobs, cutting the hollowed-out bread into bite-size chunks.
- Fill the cavities with the spinach and cheese mixtures.
- The cobs can either be served fresh or warmed in the oven.

We will be making this recipe for the Leaders' Meeting on 31<sup>st</sup> August.

#### Ants
